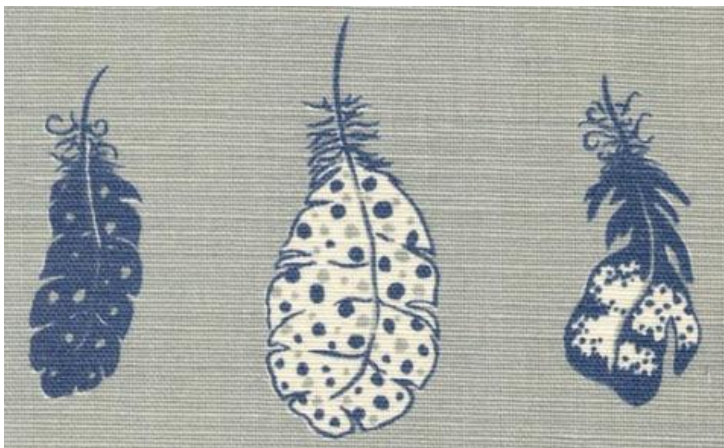

Educational Charities

The Neville Hayman Charity



The Worshipful Company of Upholders' Neville Hayman charity was instituted in memory of Neville Barton Hayman, who was Master Upholder in 1952. It is a specialised charity for the purpose of education and recognises the highest achievement in the upholstery craft.

The charity makes bursaries to upholstery students and grants prizes to students for their work and awards to upholsterers for their achievement.
